She is currently co-authoring a book tentatively entitled, “The Christian Family’s Guide to Celebrating Kwanzaa,” and working diligently to build the interactive networks of Brand Nu Words.

Charisse has served as a speaker or presenter for numerous organizations and schools, including the National Council of Negro Women, Section of the Oranges; the National Science Foundation; Quality Education for Minorities Network; the National Council of University and Research Administrators; and several elementary schools in Washington, DC, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, and Atlanta.
