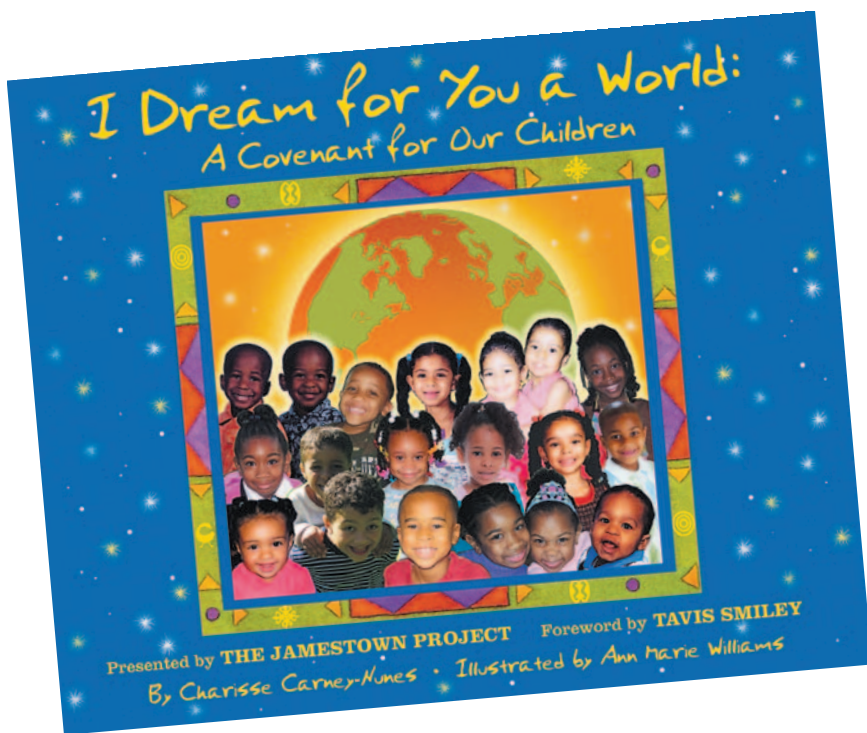


# Teach Them Well

"Children are less than 50 percent of our population but are 100 percent of our future," said *Dream* author Charisse Carney-Nunes, a mother of two.

So when Tavis Smiley published *The Covenant with Black America* in 2006, the bestselling book that addresses the primary concerns of African Americans and which created a groundswell of action, Carney-Nunes was determined to include children in the movement.

"The book is intended as a tool to share with children the kind of world that we dream about for them, and to inspire them to dream and create a better world for themselves," said Carney-Nunes (pic-



tured), a Harvard Law School grad and senior vice-president of The Jamestown Project, a Massachu-

setts-based think tank.

reader on a lyrical journey leading to a child's understanding of the fundamental principles that were set forth in *The Covenant*. Using poetry, laced with intergenerational concepts and brilliant collage, the book pieces together a vibrant mind's view of the "better tomorrow" that everyone dreams for children. Smiley wrote the book's foreword.

"No movement for social change has ever been successful," Carney-Nunes said, "until you tap into the young people, reach into their hearts and minds and inspire them to get involved and make a difference."
